To pursue the activities related to the assessment of depredation

- in purse seine fisheries in Morocco and Tunisia
- in small-scale fisheries in Andalucía (Spain), in Sicily (Italy) and Malta

To test different mitigation measures (strengthened fishing gears, different acoustic devices such as pingers or other innovative potential measures, such as lights, alarm systems, umbrella devices, etc.)

DEPREDATION PROJECT

Mitigating dolphin depredation in Mediterranean fisheries

1st component: Ensuring technical solutions/mitigation measures to limit depredation

- Monitoring of cetacean populations
- Analysis of the interaction
- Testing mitigation technologies
- Technical and management recommendations to reduce the impact of depredation



2nd component: Replication and scaling-up at Mediterranean level

- State of depredation in the Mediterranean fisheries
- Development of a standardized monitoring methodology
- Promoting exchanges of experience and lessons learnt










MEDBYCATCH PROJECT



Phase1: 2017-2020



- 3 pilot countries: Morocco, Tunisia and Turkey
- 6 regional partners
- 9 national partners

Aim: to develop and implement a common standardized methodology to collect data on bycatch following a multi-taxa approach in view of testing mitigation measures





Phase 2: 2020-2022



- 5 pilot countries: Croatia, Italy, Morocco, Tunisia and Turkey (France and Spain for policy/advocacy)
- 7 regional partners
- 14 national partners
- Conducting trials of technical solutions/mitigation measures that are effective in reducing the impact of bycatch on vulnerable species
- ❖ Informing and supporting the development of policies related to the bycatch of vulnerable species at national and regional level (e.g. European and Mediterranean)
- Building capacities and supporting fishers to apply measures to tackle bycatch of vulnerable species























REVIEW OF AVAILABLE DATA ON CETACEAN BYCATCH IN STRANDING DATABASES

Objectives:

- collect the available information on stranded cetaceans whose causes of death have been related to interactions with fishing gears,
- assess the methods used to determine the causes of death (external examination, post mortem examination...),
- identify the gaps to be covered in order to improve the future data collection.
