In 2022 an issue was brought to the attention of the Secretariat regarding the implementation of Resolution 4.18 on the Guidelines on the granting of exceptions to Article II, paragraph 1, for the purpose of non-lethal in situ research in the Agreement Area, which provides that research activities at sea that are likely to cause harassment of cetaceans must be prohibited unless the Party in question decides to grant an exception, in which case such exception should be granted only after obtaining advice from the Scientific Committee. Many activities generating harassment within the meaning of the Guidelines of Resolution 4.18 may have been carried out in the ACCOBAMS area, but no request for exceptions have ever been submitted. The Bureau mandated the Secretariat to consult ACCOBAMS Parties on exemptions that they may have granted during the five past years. The Secretariat will present the results of this consultation.

During the 2020-2022 triennium, an ACCOBAMS marine mammal necropsy training was jointly organized by both Universities of Padova and Liege. Its main goal was to train experts biologists and veterinarians from different ACCOBAMS countries on "Best Practice Document on cetaceans' *postmortem* investigations and tissue sampling in order to gain information on possible threats for cetacean conservation".

In order to pursue and reinforce exchanges and collaboration between experts and stranding networks around ACCOBAMS Area, a draft Resolution on Cetaceans Stranding Networks will be presented. The objective is to increase and promote the use of new technologies, such as virtual reality and tele-necropsy, while encouraging collaboration so to facilitate exchanges of tissue samples for joint examination. As requested during MOP7, a study on the legal status of stranding networks in some ACCOBAMS Countries and the creation of an ACCOBAMS emergency task force (highlighting the situation in the Black Sea) to assist with emergencies and unusual mortality events were made and will be presented.
