2. Local transportation from the airport to the hotel

Participants will arrive at the Tunis-Carthage International Airport, approximately 20 kilometres (25 minutes) from Ramada Plaza Hotel.

In Tunisia, you will have to organize and pay your taxi to reach the Ramada Plaza Hotel upon your arrival and to return to the airport on the day of your departure.

The taxi ride Airport / Ramada Plaza should not normally exceed 10-15 Euros (including luggage) during the day. Please make sure the trip is metered (ask for it). This rate is to be multiplied by 2 from 9 pm onward.

We advise you to take the yellow taxis.

You can get Tunisian Dinars in the airport in exchange office or at the cash machine.

4. Interesting places to visit in Tunis

Tunis “La Medina”: Located on the Gulf of Tunis, the capital is a modern metropolis that has many aspects that may be discovered strolling in its picturesque streets. Centred around the Avenue Bourguiba - the great central artery - do not miss the cathedral “St Vincent de Paul” built in 1882, the souks of the city and countless stalls arranged by profession at the west end of the avenue. The citadel of the Medina has been a witness to several centuries of prosperity and influence of Tunis in the Islamic world. The medina is a World Heritage Site for its architectural quality with nearly 700 buildings clustered around the Grand Mosque Ez-Zitouna, palaces, mosques, mausoleums, madrasas and fountains, and other.

“Les Côtes de Carthage”, La Goulette: Well known for its port and its restaurants, **Gammarth** with its small village, forest and creeks still preserved.

Sidi Bou Saïd, Marsa, and Carthage: The elegant village of **Sidi Bou Said**, a real tourist attraction with its white houses and blue doors and its famous “Cafe des nattes”. **Carthage**, a residential suburb, classified as the world heritage site by UNESCO. There, one can discover the remains of the largest African city from the time of the Phoenicians and Romans. It is still possible to see the ruins of the Roman baths of Antoninus (300 meters long), a small part of the foundations of the port, and the mosaics on some home floors.
