RESTAURANT RECOMMENDATIONS

Here are just a few recommendations for restaurants in the Limassol area, accessible from the Crowne Plaza Hotel where you can have dinner. You can of course have dinner at the Hotel, but why not explore the vibrant coastal city of Limassol and enjoy a variety of dishes!

Dasoudi / Crowne Plaza Hotel Area (0-20 min walk east)

Within a 5-minute walk eastward (to the right of the hotel), along the water front you can find <u>Columbia Beach</u>, <u>Fat</u> <u>Fish Restaurant</u> and <u>NOA Restaurant</u>.

Continue walking eastward for another 10-15mins, and you can find <u>Dasoudi restaurant</u>, <u>Bistrot 55</u> and <u>Vista Mare</u> along the water front, and <u>Santa Maria tavern</u> on the opposite side of the street.

Within a 5-min walk westward from the hotel, you can find a vegan food truck. Turn left as you exit the hotel and walk along the seafront promenade. Take the first right. <u>Fed by Nature Food Truck</u>, offers vegan fast-food meals. It will be on your right-hand side less than 200m down the street.

Enaerios Area (~20 min walk west)

The area of Enaerios offers several dining options. The name "Enaerios" ("Ev α έριος" in Greek, meaning "aerial") comes from the old Enaerios Pier that once served as a loading point for cargo suspended on cables — a small piece of Limassol's industrial history. You can still see the Pier extending into the sea.

On the way to Enaerios, walk westward from the Crowne Plaza Hotel. Before you reach Enaerios, you can find <u>Musa</u>, ShipInn and TGI Fridays.

North of the Enaerios area, you can find several other dining options. <u>Gastra</u> ("Pot" in Greek) and <u>Charcoal Grill</u>, offer traditional food and local vibes.

Molos Area (~25 min walk west)

The Molos area (Greek: Μόλος, meaning "pier" or "quay") is the most iconic part of the Limassol Seafront Promenade, stretching between the Old Port and the Enaerios district. Molos is the social heart of Limassol — a beautifully landscaped linear park by the sea that blends art, leisure, and local life.

It lies about 2.5 km west of the Crowne Plaza Hotel — an easy 25-minute walk along the coastal path or a 5–7-minute taxi ride.

Along the Promenade there are several budget friendly options for coffee, food and drinks: <u>Thalassokoritso</u>, <u>Theatraki</u>, <u>Thalassaki</u>. Further west and towards the Old Port area, you can find the <u>Red</u> (recommended pizza place), <u>Caffé Nero Blue</u> and <u>Yellow Café</u>.

Several restaurants on the northern side of Molos (opposite side from the water, and across the main road) can be found, including Meze Taverna, The Modern Kitchen, and Bootleggers.

Saripolou Square / Area (~40 min walk west)

Five to ten minutes north from the Molos Area, you can find Saripolou Square. The Saripolou area is located in the historic centre of Limassol and forms the cultural and nightlife hub of Limassol.

What used to be a quiet neighbourhood of small workshops and old houses has been beautifully transformed into a pedestrian-friendly maze of cafés, taverns, wine bars, and restaurants, mixing old Cypriot charm with modern urban energy.

Among the options here, you can find the Food Court Limassol AGORA, as well as the restaurant Fries With Benefits.

Old Port Area (~45 min walk west)

The Old Port area sits at the western edge of the Limassol seafront, between the Molos Promenade and the Limassol Marina. Built in the late 19th century, the Old Port served as Cyprus's main commercial harbour until the 1970s, when operations moved to the New Limassol Port further west. The Old Port has been fully redeveloped into a modern leisure and dining hub, blending Limassol's maritime heritage with a fresh, cosmopolitan atmosphere. You can find several dining options here.

Within the Old Port, you can find <u>FRESHA Healthy Cuisine Restaurant</u>, <u>Kypriakon Restaurant</u> serving traditional food with a twist and <u>Thymari</u> ("Thyme" in Greek) which offers value for money food, from pita with gyros to vegan pitas.

Castle Area (~45 min walk west)

This area includes the castle itself, which houses the Cyprus Medieval Museum and offers views of the city and sea from its roof, as well as a surrounding plaza filled with cafes, restaurants, and shops. The marriage of Richard the Lionheart and Berengaria of Navarre in 1191, traditionally said to have taken place here.

There are many options for dinner, including <u>Artima</u>, <u>Draught Microbrewery</u>, <u>Karatello Tavern</u>, all part of the <u>Carob</u> Mill Restaurants where our Gala dinner will take place. You can also dine at Il Castello and Ousia Soulful Kitchen.

Limassol Marina Area (~50 min walk west)

The Limassol Marina lies immediately west of the Old Port, forming the western end of the city's seafront promenade. Opened in 2014, Limassol Marina is one of Cyprus's most striking modern landmarks — a luxury waterfront development that combines a working marina, elegant dining, boutique shopping, and upscale residences. The Marina offers an excellent mix of mid-range to moderately priced restaurants and cafés (Paul, Wagamama, TGI Fridays).



Options for getting around instead of walking

EMEL Limassol City <u>Bus</u> Route #30 passes right infront of Crowne Plaza Hotel and goes westward all the way to Limassol Marina and beyond (My mall Limassol), and all the way eastward to Dasoudi area and beyond (Parklane Hotel).

You can catch the #30 bus from the two closest stops: Promachon Eleftherias - KEAN 1 to the east, or 28 Oktovriou - Debenhams 1 to the west.

Single Journey tickets (€2 between 04:00-21:00, €3 between 21:00-04.00) can be purchased from the Bus Driver on the bus to get to any destination. A daily bus card can also be issued on the bus, allowing unlimited travel within one day for €6.00. Details for specific routes and more information, can be found here: EMEL Limassol Buses

Several <u>taxi</u> companies are available within the city of Limassol. Taxis can be booked by phone, or hired directly from the street, and are equipped with taximeters – the use of which is obligatory.

The ride-hailing app <u>Bolt</u> operates in Limassol. You can download the app (iOS, Android) for free and set up your account in advance for smooth use. Pre-booking or scheduling rides ahead is also supported.

There is also the option to rent a bike, you can easily find a <u>NextBike</u> along Molos area and rent it through the relevant app.
